There were two other elements of the founding mission. First, "to train and develop the moral faculties which at this period of life are so susceptible to culture." And second, "to afford all the comforts and as many as possible of the pleasures and advantages of home, during this period of training."

As much as Kiski has grown and changed significantly in the 132 years since Andrew Wilson penned those words, we've always remained faithful and true to these three central principles. As you review our new strategic plan, you'll see that these themes are recognizable and present in the goals and objectives we've outlined.

INITIATIVES

- Implement Kiski's recently-published Diversity Action Plan, which includes tangible initiatives and measurable goals that advance our commitment to being a community dedicated to anti-racism.
- Develop a series of essential questions that guide us in exploring augmented project-based learning models, improved alternative assessment tools, and new mechanisms for showcasing to colleges the progress and achievements of our students.
- Refine and expand Kiski's Residential Life Curriculum in order to encourage the development and growth of each student's character, leadership skills, and understanding of himself.
- Continue to develop initiatives like ONE Kiski, which creatively leverage technology to deliver high-quality programs through non-traditional learning platforms.
- Utilize Kiski's alumni network and corporate community connections to develop and launch a Career Pathways Program that will allow students to build skills and forge experiences that will prepare them for their future professions.
- Continue to allocate financial resources to attract and retain outstanding faculty and staff.
- Expand the funding available for faculty and staff to engage in professional development opportunities that will allow them to participate in regular training on innovative teaching practices, curriculum design, and diversity.
- Identify ways to use the unique natural habitat of our campus to strengthen Kiski's sustainability and conservation programs while showcasing our Campus as Classroom initiative.
- Implement an enhanced fitness program that will support the conditioning, athleticism, and wellness of the entire Kiski community.



INITIATIVES

- Evaluate our existing programs for supporting the emotional and physical health of our students and develop new instruments to regularly assess and monitor the overall well-being of each student in our care.
- Expand our Learning Center resources to include new programs that fully-support students who come to Kiski with diverse learning styles and a range of talents, abilities, and backgrounds.
- Create new programs centered around diversity, equity, and inclusion and use them as guideposts for promoting and understanding ethical leadership.
- Hire and retain dynamic teachers who embrace boarding school life and who actively engage in supporting our students within and beyond the classroom.
- Unify Kiski's messaging to ensure that communication with all Kiski stakeholders is clear and consistent.
- Develop and deploy a system for veteran faculty evaluation that provides a structured forum for dialogues about best teaching practices and encourages professional growth.
- Support Kiski's faculty, staff, and their families by maintaining supportive workplace environments and allocating necessary resources to enhance on-campus living.
- Provide resources and support for Kiski coaches that will further develop their skills and networking channels to stimulate outreach efforts to talented student-athletes.



INITIATIVES

- Refine the tools we use to measure revenue, control expenses, and forecast the variables that impact Kiski's financial condition in order to maintain fiscal stability and grow our institutional enterprises.
- Continue to support a tuition model that keeps costs as affordable as possible for Kiski families.
- Boost our recruitment efforts by promoting Kiski's value proposition through new marketing initiatives to attract well-qualified students.
- Regularly review and update Kiski's emergency response plans in order to be prepared for any and all challenges in the future.
- Develop a comprehensive information technology plan that addresses infrastructure needs, access to equipment, and a cost schedule for replacements and upgrades.
- Focus our fundraising goals on meaningful endowment growth and support for operational scholarships while raising participation levels in Kiski's annual and planned giving programs.
- Look for opportunities and partnerships that offer new sources of auxiliary income.
- Develop a long-term capital improvement plan to afford continual care and growth of Kiski's physical plant.



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
