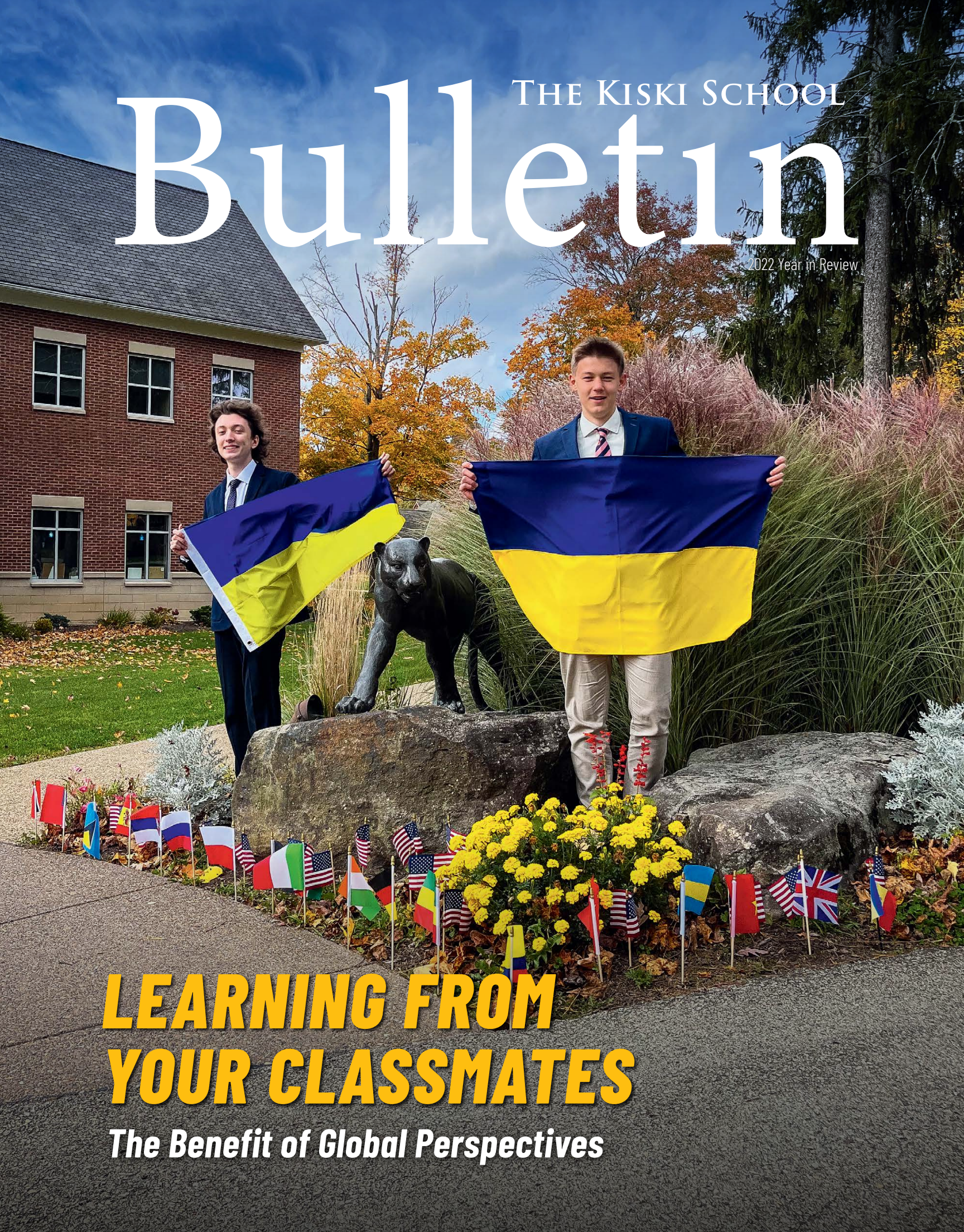

HONORS CONVOCATION

Honors Convocation is traditionally our last formal school-wide function. Underclassmen are recognized for superlative achievement in and beyond the classroom before a week of final exams that concludes with commencement. By then, the returning Kiski Boys are off enjoying their summer breaks (or anxiously awaiting their final grades).

Student Speaker **Luke Waltrip '22** led off the event and centered his remarks around the theme of Kiski's uncommon culture saying, "Community is a word that is commonly thrown around when talking about our campus, but I feel like many don't acknowledge the immense power behind it. The Kiski Brotherhood binds us together and allows us to thrive. This is what I love about Kiski, people from diverse backgrounds coming together to support another community member in need."

Luke also commended the adaptability of the Kiski campus family, specifically how it traversed different stages of the pandemic during his time on campus. "The Kiski community has the ability to adapt through campus changes. In the two years I have been here, we went from full quarantine mode with a modified dress code to family-style meals and no masks. We adapt. We change. We support each other. We've got each other's backs no matter what happens."

Assistant Head of School **Mr. Ryan John** continued highlighting the full community by reminding the boys that, although only a select few of them would receive awards that evening, they should all be recognized for, "The greatness that happens in our classrooms day in and day out. Whether you are here at Kiski next year, or you're headed off to college, you will face new challenges and you will be ready because of the hard work that you put in here competing with other bright and talented boys," he concluded.

Once the last awardees were recognized, refreshments were enjoyed and photos taken, the boys returned to their dorms to prepare for their final week of school. Head of School **Mr. Chris Brueningsen's** closing remarks from last year's Honors Convocation had come to pass. Campus life this year *did* much more closely resemble the normalcy that we were living before the pandemic. The Boys had rallied to support each other through the rigors and triumphs for the 134th consecutive year of Kiski's existence.

SENIOR AWARDS CEREMONY

The tent on the Yukevich Quad filled just as a downpour began. Fortunately, the sound system and parent speaker **Mr. Carlos Correa Negrete's '92, P'22** booming voice rose above the din. He recounted his time as a Kiski Boy and how it prepared him as a context for his assertion that Kiski Boys remain on path toward success, a trajectory unchanged over the history of the School. "With the Kiski essence in place, Kiski Boys have made, are making and will make a positive impact on society for years to come," he declared just as the spring shower ceased.

Mr. Correa's remarks were followed by reflections from retiring Director of Technology **Mr. Marcus Muster H'22, P'16**. Mr. Muster started teaching at Kiski a year before Mr. Correa's arrival in the fall of 1987 and this commencement was the last of his 35. He began by telling the story of his uneasy arrival on the Kiski campus to work at his first Kiski football camp. He—as he surmised many of the seniors had too—struggled to adjust before settling into his place among the football team. "As I stand here today, I

feel so lucky to have found Kiski—and although I didn't know it at the time—all that I had done and been a part of for the first 22 years of my life was preparing me for this opportunity, to work at an all-boys boarding school in rural Pennsylvania. I think it is safe to say that we both have benefited from our time here," Mr. Muster said as he addressed the Class of 2022.

Speaking specifically of friendships formed, Mr. Muster said, "You know making friends isn't an exact science. Most of the time you make friends by gravitating towards people that you have common interests with. Sometimes you become friends with the people that you just end up spending so much time with: teammates, roommates and classmates. And sometimes you become friends with the most unlikely of people for the most uncommon of common reasons."

He completed that thought by saying, "Like you seniors, I'm leaving Kiski with many great friends that will continue to last a lifetime. You may go a few years without seeing or hearing from your

Kiski brothers and friends, but trust me the minute you pick up the phone, see each other at reunion, send each other a text, run into each other by coincidence, connect via social media, it will be like you never missed a beat."

Head of School **Mr. Chris Brueningsen** began his closing remarks by commending the seniors for navigating two and a half challenging years. He had prepared his theme by asking the faculty, "What's the best piece of advice you've ever received." He organized the responses selected for his speech into three categories: Do it right. Know yourself—understand your strengths and limitations. Be kind.

With Mr. Brueningsen's last bits of collected advice shared, and his desire for many returns from the Class of 2022 repeated once more, Associate Head of School Mr. Mark Novom reminded the seniors of their final responsibilities regarding the next day's commencement. He then dismissed them to a final night of revelry before receiving their diplomas.

KISKI'S 134TH COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

Chairman of Kiski's Board of Trustees **Mr. John Jacob Sr. '89, P'18, P'20, P'23** began Kiski's 134-year-old tradition by bestowing a rare award upon retiring Director of Technology **Mr. Marcus Muster H'22, P'16**. The Class of 2022 gained a 68th member as he was presented an honorary diploma. The plaque accompanying his diploma read in part, "In recognition of his remarkable tenure, and a steadfast dedication to scholarly pursuits, we proudly award him an honorary Kiski diploma and confer upon him the title Director of Technology Emeritus."

Head of School **Mr. Chris Brueningsen** then introduced Head Prefect **Alex Figueroa '22** for his address. Alex recounted the troubling uncertainty brought on by the pandemic that started during his class's sophomore year, and how they moved beyond those hard times. With hindsight, he made light of that destabilizing period saying, "I mention this not to remind everyone that COVID is a party pooper—I'm sure we all know that."

He also highlighted the relief and extra excitement that occurred on

campus when fun traditions that may have been taken for granted previously were maintained or returned. "The International Food Festival was a prime example. Although, we were accustomed to having it in the Turley Dining Hall, COVID required us to have it outdoors scattered throughout the Yukevich Quad. The weather was amazing. The food was delicious, and it simply felt good to be outside again. Both faculty and students were able to interact without restrictions," he recalled fondly.

Back-to-(Pause)-to-Back Champions

Last November, Kiski soccer captured a second consecutive Pennsylvania Independent Schools Athletic Association (PISAA) title. The Cougars were in control for nearly the entire game and ultimately won 4-2. However, a skilled Germantown team entered the game on a 17-game winning streak and had several solid scoring chances. Fortunately, the Kiski Boys were able to turn all but the two threats away.

When the game clock showed all zeros and the win was official, the boys sprinted to the fence separating them from the fans. There they celebrated with their classmates who bussed across the state to support them. Then they congregated at the far goal to take team photos with the 2021 championship plaque that is now displayed in the Ross Athletic Center next to their first plaque earned during the 2019 season.

Years from now, it may be lost on visitors that those titles were won consecutively. The 2020 season—disrupted by the pandemic—was not decided by a championship tournament. Therefore,

the Cougar's title defense did not resume until the fall of 2021.

It should also be noted that the 2021 title may have been most in doubt during the penultimate game against Shipley. After topping the Hill School in the PAISAA quarterfinals, Kiski hosted a physical Shipley team for the right to advance to the final. Shipley temporarily quieted a raucous crowd after tallying the first score. It wasn't until late in the contest that the equalizing goal crossed the goal line and Head Coach **Jonty Loukes** made a fateful decision that likely decided that game and the title run.

"Kiski had just tied the game up, and with about 15 minutes left of regulation time I was already thinking shootout," recounted Loukes. "During the practices leading up to the state tournament we were practicing penalty kicks. This is fun for the field players, but particularly fun for the goalkeepers because of their chance to outfox the shooters. **Aitor [Lopez Barriga '22]** thrived in this environment. He's 6'4" and has a wingspan just as big so he is a daunting figure in the goal."

“Aitor had not played any part of the semi-final game or the previous game against The Hill School, but at that moment I told Aitor to warm up as he would be going in goal for the shootout. Regulation and overtime finished with no goals scored and Aitor took his place between the posts for the shootout. Aitor saved one of the first five penalty kicks and as the shootout moved to sudden-death, Kiski needed a save to prevent Shipley from winning. Aitor came up with a big save. Kiski scored their next penalty kick and then Aitor again came up with another save to send Kiski into the state final,” said Loukes.

The Cougars were met by their classmates on their field to celebrate the big semifinal win. The delayed title defense may have made the latest championship that much sweeter for the players and their proud Kiski Brothers. We should know if the Cougars have enough remaining soccer magic to extend the championship streak to a three-peat just before this issue hits mailboxes. Go Cougars!

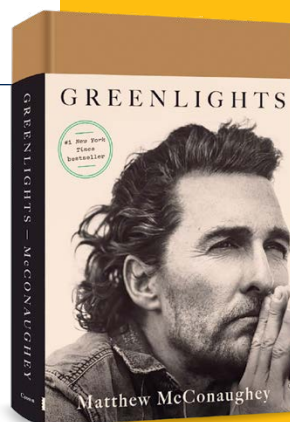

AN INTERNATIONAL ADVANTAGE

In addition to the advantages afforded Kiski by its rural, boys-only, and small school attributes; the School maintains a long tradition of enrolling young men from all over the world.

Although the majority of Kiski Boys call the United States—and of that group mostly Pennsylvania—home, 23 countries are represented on campus this year. The Boys share their unique perspectives concerning current events, upbringings, and culture (and yes, sometimes debate the superiority of their sports teams, food and music).

This year, we are excited to welcome two Ukrainian students to Kiski through a program called *Project Safe Harbor*, an initiative that is bringing Ukrainian young people in crisis to American boarding schools and colleges. The program is being coordinated through the Association of Boarding Schools and the Association of Military Colleges and Schools of the United States. The Ukrainian government fully supports the project along with the Ukrainian Global University and Ukrainian Global Scholars Foundation. The cost of their boarding tuitions is being covered by generous Kiski sponsors.

Andrii Maltsev '23 joins us from Chernihivska in northern Ukraine. He attended one of the top schools in Ukraine and was the president of his class. He has an interest in studying economics, international relations and computer science.

Andrii joined the soccer team and enjoys the campus' diversity, including his Italian roommate. "It changes how you see the world from different angles," remarked Andrii.

Mykhailo Mizin '24 joins us from outside Crimea. He has a strong interest in urbanism and politics and was instrumental in creating a student forum in his previous school to discuss politics and complex issues. Like many Ukrainian students, he was concerned about his ability to continue his studies after Russia invaded Ukraine in February of 2022.

He proactively pursued multiple options and when Mykhailo became aware of the Ukrainian Global University initiative he applied immediately. Associate Head of School for Enrollment Management Bramble Buran provided him with an captivating glimpse of what he could expect at Kiski during the application process. "We had a conversation, not just an interview, and she got to know me not just a student but as a whole person."

Mykhailo shared that his mission is to use what he learns in the United States to help rebuild his country. This sentiment echoes one of Kiski's primary objectives, to graduate young men who multiply the impact of the investment in their educations by positively impacting the communities they subsequently join. Meanwhile, all Kiski Boys are enriched by their time together. ♣

It is the teacher that makes the difference. The knowledge the teacher brings of his or her subject along with the driving desire to share this information can shape the life of a student forever. Excellent teaching is an art. It takes years of dedicated practice, fine-tuning, and growth through trial and error by the practitioner to achieve excellence. Hours of preparation mixed with some boldness, pedagogical talent, knowledge, and dedication come together to produce an outstanding teacher. At Kiski, we have enjoyed the blessings of many superb teachers over the years. This section of the Bulletin is dedicated to honoring excellent Kiski teachers, our Luminaries. In this space, we remember teachers who shared their brilliance and enlightened generations of Kiski Boys.

KISKI AND THE SZILAGYI FAMILY HOSTED A CELEBRATION OF LIFE to honor the memory of **Tamas Szilagyi** during Reunion Weekend 2022. Common themes and specific stories regarding Pops’ five decades of service have been wistfully shared informally since his December 23, 2021 passing, and the gathering during Reunion Weekend provided a space to formally recognize the Kiski legacy Pops etched into the bedrock of the School’s foundation.

Broad smiles, laughter and tears of joyful remembrance spread across the Clark Theater within the Rogers Fine Arts Center. Speaker **Brendan Moriarty ’86**, Kiski’s Director of Studies and a *lifelong* student of Mr. Szilagyi’s, wondered what Pops would think of a formal event convened in his

honor. “I can only imagine him looking a little suspicious, rolling his eyes, taking a drag on a cigarette, then insisting he didn’t roll his eyes, and then offering me a new drink as he asks me if I believe that this Zelensky is for real, can he hold on, did I understand the relevance of the Donbas for the Ukrainian economy, did I read what Tim Snyder had to say, did you see what they wrote in the Guardian, why the hell did Messi go to PSG? Pops had, let us say, a volatile, impatient relationship with formal occasions and expectations, especially when they were about him,” said Moriarty.

Tamas Szilagyi expanded and influenced many minds using all forums made available to him in Kiski’s unique boarding school environment. He had a signature teaching style born of legendarily diligent preparation and an unquenchable thirst for knowledge that generations of Kiski Boys benefited from one conversation at a time, in and—perhaps more importantly—beyond the classroom.

“When you’re 15 years old and left to your own devices, or lack thereof, it’s tough. It’s a hard age. You’re surrounded by the failures of your own immaturity—what seem like a lot of ugly mistakes and embarrassing weaknesses. Kiski made you face them, either by design or by circumstance. So you begin to look around for examples of what some folks might call accomplishment but what I’ll call beauty. You want to be delivered from your condition. Transported. When I think back on it—Tom was that kind of example. He was that transcendent figure,” shared **David Conrad ’85**.

what propelled events that would change history. This approach was indeed revolutionary for fledgling minds. Instead of learning how to ace a test, we were trained by Pops to think for ourselves," summarized **Tim Grubbs '85**.

Head of School **Chris Brueningsen** spoke to his influence as a mentor. "Tamas taught me so much about being a teacher. His philosophy of teaching, a nod to the Hippocratic Oath, was: 'First, do no harm.' His preparation for his classes was meticulous. On many visits, I'd see a dozen open books and Xeroxed articles on his kitchen table with passages underlined and highlighted with notes in the margins and a yellow legal pad with outlines for his lessons. There are probably a hundred books in our school library with Szilagyi notes and scribbles in the margins. He taught me that planning for class is serious business and that teaching is, in many ways, a creative, artistic enterprise," he said.

Tamas was also known as a superlative soccer player and phenomenal coach. He stood in opposition to George Bernard Shaw's belief that, "Those who can, do; those who can't, teach." The sight of Tamas passing through campus while casually juggling a soccer ball

that never passed from his control to the ground below is a ubiquitous vision for many from his time at Kiski. And Kiski Boys yearned to qualify for the varsity soccer team he led.

"Two of us, David Boesel and I, having played for years while we were at Shady Side Academy, dreamt of the next year when we could try to qualify for the Varsity and play for the esteemed Mr. Szilagyi. His reputation preceded him, and we knew of his track record of playing in Hungary and then when he arrived in the United States," recounted **Bill Borden '70**.

Pops and Bill Borden's 1969 soccer team members were 2015 inductees of Kiski's nascent Athletic Hall of Fame, established in 2013 with a healthy backlog of worthy entrants. "It was stated that our team changed the direction of Kiski soccer and, if true, and based on what I saw of Kiski soccer last season, we are flattered indeed," said Borden.

An enduring memory from that evening was seeing Tamas hold court on the porch of Fair Hall with his former players. Both coach and students beamed with the same youthful exuberance that provided a window into distant events and bonds unscathed by time.

"We can all take comfort knowing that Tamas's legacy is secure. The memories and stories will be shared and re-told by all of us and passed down to future generations of Kiski Boys. That's a fitting tribute to this Kiski legend," concluded Brueningsen. We can dedicate ourselves to the cultivation of his spirit of bottomless inquisitiveness, deft guidance, warm greetings—and yes, even streaks of rebelliousness—that live on at Kiski and in those he inspired. ♣

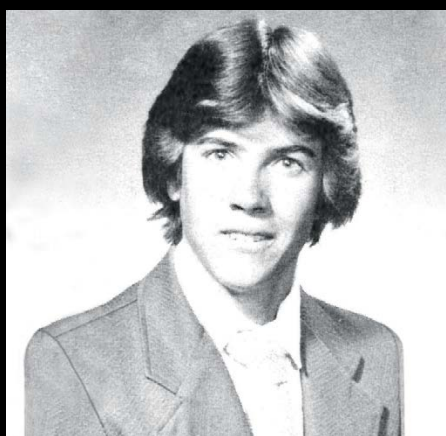

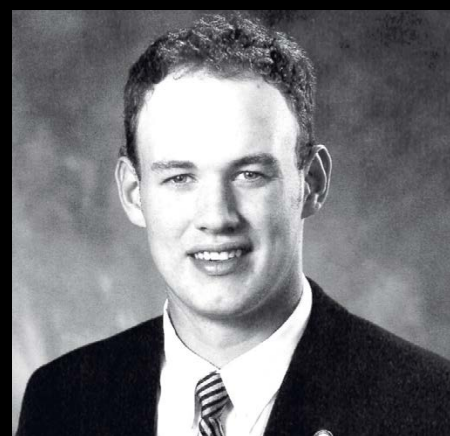

PATRICK GREENWELL '77

Patrick Greenwell, Class of 1977, coached The University of Alabama's divers for 29 years. His divers garnered 69 All-America awards, 21 Southeastern Conference (SEC) titles and two National Championships. Mr. Greenwell was named NCAA Coach of the Year, SEC Coach of the Year six times and guided his student-athletes to eight SEC Diver of the Year awards. Before Alabama, Mr. Greenwell coached at Clemson for five years where he was named Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Coach of the Year twice, and he coached six ACC Champions and three NCAA All-Americans. As a collegiate-athlete, Mr. Greenwell earned All-America honors diving for The University of Pittsburgh. As a Kiski diver, he smashed league records, remarkably establishing a new league mark by over a hundred points his senior year.



KYLE DAVIS '08

Kyle Davis, Class of 2008, lettered in each of his four years as a golfer, hockey player and lacrosse player. He was captain for multiple seasons including three golf teams, two hockey teams, and two lacrosse teams. As a lacrosse player, Mr. Davis was named to three consecutive all-league teams, tallying an astounding 48 goals and 10 assists as a senior. Mr. Davis was heavily recruited to play lacrosse in college; however, he chose to pursue golf at Queens University of Charlotte. During his tenure at Queens, Mr. Davis was a top conference player and contributed to two conference titles.

The Hall of Fame honors those alumni, teams and coaches who have made outstanding contributions to Kiski athletics. The nominees exemplify the core values they learned at Kiski: principles of integrity, humility, sportsmanship and service.

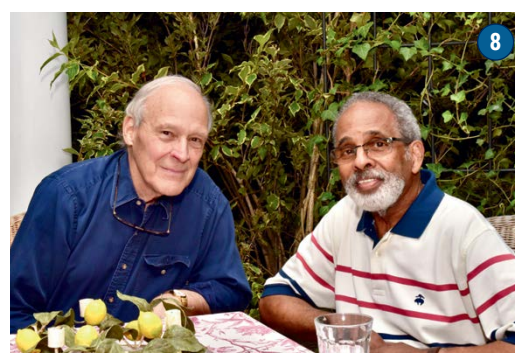
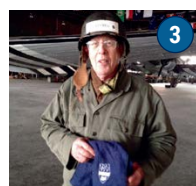
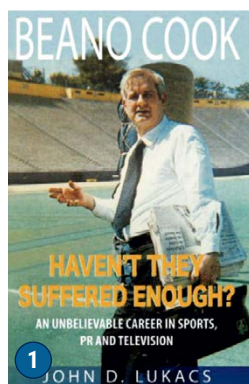

14TH ANNUAL WILL'S GIFT

Kevin Scanlon '92

Will's Gift is named in honor of **E. William Turley '64**, one of the finest educators in Kiski's history. Although he was not an artist himself in any traditional sense of the word, his 35 years on the campus could be called nothing but a masterpiece. His devotion to his students knew no bounds and he inspired many of them to be, if not artists, then whole and true versions of themselves. The hope is that the campus itself will become an archive and teaching center, a living and virtual gallery of the region's finest work. "If enough small fires can light an entire community, let Will's Gift be the fuel for one of them," said **David Conrad '85**, co underwriter of Will's Gift along with **Kristofer Rockwell '90**.

This year's Will's Gift recipient is **Kevin Scanlon '92**. Scanlon is an award winning photographer who has worked with an impressive array of celebrities, artists, musicians, athletes and everyday people. Recently, images from his coronavirus Mask Portrait Project were chosen for the *American Photography Photo Annual*, shortlisted for *Communication*

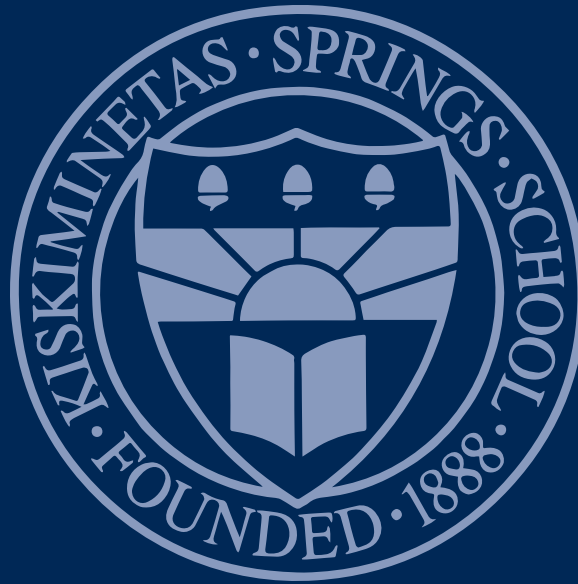

Dear Friends,

Kiski continues our commitment to raise funds to keep our School strong and growing. Our new ***For the Boys Campaign*** enables us to open our doors to boys who truly deserve to be at Kiski and who cannot afford it all on their own. Financial aid provides deserving students the opportunity of top-quality education which otherwise might be unobtainable and provides Kiski with a highly qualified student body from varied walks of life.

Since 2010, Kiski has awarded over \$50 million in tuition assistance to nearly 700 families. The COVID-19 pandemic has increased the need for financial aid. Enrollment of full-tuition international students was greatly impacted and reinforces that Kiski needs to continue to seek scholarship support. In addition, we are implementing financial and marketing initiatives to move Kiski into the future with high enrollment and impact. In 2019, Kiski was the first independent school in the United States to reset tuition; it is now 20% lower than peer institutions. This tuition reset led to great increases in inquiries and applications. Even with the impact of the pandemic, Kiski continues to enroll over 190 students annually and we anticipate growth in future years.

Kiski is on a positive course to impact the lives of more boys through increased financial aid offerings, the tuition reset, and increased outreach. Our admissions team is focused on attracting students

within our traditional markets as well as from new areas domestically and internationally to attract full-pay students along with those who may need financial aid.

For the Boys is poised to raise \$5 million over the next three years for scholarships and financial aid from generous grants and gifts as well as through the Pennsylvania Educational Improvement Tax Credit Program and Special Purpose Entities (see page 66 for more information on EITC and SPE). Already over \$1 million has been raised in new pledges and gifts during our early quiet phase of this new capital campaign for Kiski.

Kiski continues to provide boys the highest quality of education each and every day in the classroom, in the dorms, and on the playing fields. Your personal support of this new ***For the Boys Campaign*** will help many deserving students, and it will directly sustain the School and our important mission for many years to come.
